



**DECLARATION OF A LOCAL STATE OF DISASTER**

**WHEREAS,** The County of Hopkins, beginning Monday, January 30, 2023, has suffered widespread severe damages and loss of property (or imminent threat of the same) resulting from the Winter Storm generating:

**Wintry Mix, Sleet, Snow, Reoccurring Precipitation,  
Prolonged Freezing Temperatures, Accumulative Ice; and**

**WHEREAS,** The County Judge of Hopkins County has determined that extraordinary measures must be taken to alleviate the suffering of people and to protect or rehabilitate property; and

**WHEREAS,** Hopkins County has experienced damages that have caused widespread and severe destruction as well as loss of property to the County and its citizens (including but not limited to):

**Damaged Homes, Buildings, Roads, Bridges, Parks And Playgrounds;  
Down Powerlines, Extended Power Outages, Food Spoilage, Fallen Trees,  
Hazardous Debris, and**

**THEREFORE,** I authorize the public resources of Hopkins County and cities of this county to use all available resources to cope with this disaster; and

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE JUDGE OF THE COUNTY OF**


**HOPKINS:** That a local state of disaster is hereby declared for Hopkins County, Texas.


1. That the County's Emergency Management Plan has been implemented.


